



Mountain Meadow Turns Fifteen

Fifteen years ago volunteers organized and ran Mountain Meadow's first summer program for young people from lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer (LGBTQ) and other non-traditional families. Eighteen youth attended camp that first summer. Today Mountain Meadow has grown to be a year-round organization with two full-time staff members, an office in Philadelphia's LGBTQ community center, and a fifteen member Board of Directors. Mountain Meadow now serves over 100 youth a year and that number will continue to grow!

New This Year

Every year since its inception, Mountain Meadow has expanded to meet the growing need for programming for youth from LGBTQ families. This year is no exception. Mountain Meadow's Board of Directors met in February to revise the organization's mission and vision statements. These statements will help guide the organization through the coming years.

New Mission and Vision

Mission: Mountain Meadow is a progressive and diverse community dedicated to providing a supportive and safe space for all children of LGBTQ (Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer) and other non-traditional families and their allies.

Vision: Mountain Meadow creates a safe and supportive community where children of LGBTQ families are empowered to affirm and appreciate family diversity. We aspire to incorporate these

values that will challenge oppression and create on-going social change. Through the cultivation of multi-generational relationships, Mountain Meadow will enhance communication skills and cultural acceptance while providing programming specific to awareness and celebration of non-traditional families and their allies. Mountain Meadow instills our children with the confidence to be competent in the face of ignorance and intolerance.

Program Director

Mountain Meadow doubled the organization's year-round staff this year with the addition of a new Program Director position. This new position will allow Mountain Meadow to expand to meet the growing need for programming. This expansion will mean more programming for you and your family! "When was the first time you met someone else from an LGBTQ family?" His response was all too common. "Today," he replied.
